NYLC Partners with 9/11 Day for 'Tomorrow Together'

ST. PAUL, Minn. (August 23, 2016) —National Youth Leadership Council (NYLC) is partnering with nonprofit 9/11 Day to promote “Tomorrow Together,” an initiative encouraging service and national unity on the 15th anniversary of the September 11 attacks.

“We are proud to be a partner of 9/11 Day,” said NYLC Interim CEO Amy Meuers. “By not only dedicating the day to service but encouraging service-learning throughout the year, together we can honor those we lost and spread the themes of unity and empathy.”

“Tomorrow Together” is a new five-year alliance between more than 40 organizations that will officially launch on September 11, 2016, and go through the 20th anniversary of 9/11 in 2021. Some of the included organizations include Teach for America, United Way Worldwide, and AARP. 9/11 Day expects nearly 30 million Americans will participate this year by performing acts of service across the nation. Service projects in New York City and Washington, DC, plan to pack 2.5 million meals for those in need. Educational lesson plans teaching empathy and service will also be available for free at 911day.org.
